Community Workday at Johnson Pond

Raleigh area Young Professionals Network (YPN) brought volunteers to Johnson Pond Early Learning Center, a first cohort POD-Wake demonstration center.

Coordinated through the Wake Smart Start office, Sarah Konradi and Caroline Asher of NLI facilitated these activities:

- Install a vine teepee in preschool space
- Remove old black plastic edging around the play structures and sandbox
- Install stumps on the path edge, to hold sand back the sandbox
- Sand and smooth stumps
- Plant 8 trees
- Create perennial planting beds in toddler area
- Plant strawberries in a repurposed gutter attached to the fence
